### 1. APPLICATION PROCESS FOR 2007/8

### 2. ELIGIBILITY AND SUITABILITY CRITERIA

In order to be considered for the Graduate Teacher Programme, **all applicants must:**

- a) Be native speakers of either French, German or Spanish
- b) Have at least the equivalent of a UK bachelor's degree. According to UK NARIC, the national agency for the comparability of international qualifications, the following qualifications are considered the equivalent of a UK bachelor's degree:

**Austria** - Magister or Doktor

**France** - Licence

**Germany** - Magister/Diplom or the Erstes Staatsexamen

**Spain** - Licenciatura

**Other countries or qualifications** – please check with UK NARIC before you apply –

- c) Possess an excellent command of spoken and written English (candidates will be asked to sit a written test at first interview)

- d) **NOT** already hold a qualification allowing them to teach at school level either in the UK or in their home country (see website for further information)

Only those candidates who are unsuccessful at the written stage of the CAPES/PLP2/other

concoors exams may be considered for placement with a training school. Candidates who are successful at the written stage may only be considered for a training school placement if they are unsuccessful in the oral examination.

e) Be currently resident in the European Economic Area (EEA - the 25 EU countries plus Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway) or Switzerland

f) Be eligible to work in the UK. Citizens of the EEA or Switzerland do not require a work permit to work in the UK. ### 3. FOREIGN LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

## 6. REFERENCES

Your references could be from someone you have worked closely with in an academic context (eg university teachers/tutors) and/or a professional context (particularly in a field relevant to work with young people). ## 7. MEDICAL AND POLICE CHECKS

If selected for the programme, you will be required to provide a medical certificate and proof that you have no criminal record (*extrait de casier judiciaire, polizeiliches Führungszeugnis, Strafregisterbescheinigung* or *certificado negativo de antecedentes penales* as appropriate).

## 8. PROOF OF NATIONALITY

Proof of nationality/right of residency will be requested at interview. The British Council is unable to intervene in any issues relating to visa or work permit applications on behalf of successfully placed trainees.

## 9. COMPLETION OF THE TRAINING YEAR

At the end of the Graduate Teacher Programme training year, successful trainees will gain Qualified Teacher Status. This will enable you to apply for work as a Newly Qualified Teacher in England or Wales. It will not enable you to work as a qualified teacher in most other European Union countries. The training is demanding and should not be considered if you intend to return to your country after only one year.
